Valentine's Day (for whatever it's worth), should not be seen as just a day to 'get', to watch to see how you will be treated, or to get romantically involved with your spouse (or anyone for that matter). It should be a day you check your heart to see if 'this kind of love' is alive within. If it is, then show it in sacrifice, in helping, in giving, in forgiving and in making it special for the one you love. I tell you, you will see LOVE ALIVE in all your relationships.
