David captured in an inadequate way, the essence of God's goodness towards us when He said, "Many." He must have been overwhelmed by God's dealings with him while attempting to number them, and came to the conclusion that His mighty works were innumerable, several and diverse - great in quality and in quantity. Still reflecting upon God's goodness, David in Psalm 116:12 asked rhetorically, "What shall I RENDER to the Lord for all His benefits toward me?"
