Sometimes we are too lazy to read and that causes delay in our deliverance from the issues we deal with. So, as we commence a new year, we must commit to be a people who study. We must make a conscious effort to stock our libraries with useful information that will help our faith, career, family, areas of struggle, or anything that would improve us and keep us on the cutting edge of our spheres of endeavors. This means, as we budget for food, clothes, and other necessities of life, we should equally set something aside for gaining knowledge which could come in form of books, audio and video messages, trainings, seminars, conferences, webinars, etc.

Wisdom, according to Proverbs 4:7 is the principal thing you need in life. Also get understanding, because the more you know, the more value you 'bring to the table' and the more indispensable you become. What often makes one person stand out amongst his peers (in life or his career) is what he knows that they don't know. KNOWLEDGE IS POWER!
